

# **Admission Policy**

Admission is open to daughters of Federal Government Employees, Residents of Federal Government Capital area and the children of diplomats stationed at Islamabad. Prep, Class I, Class XI (HSSC Part-I) and Class BS (Part-I) are the entry points for admission in ICG.

# Prep and Class-I

# Registration

Admission Notice for Prep and Class-I is advertised in the leading newspapers of Islamabad and Rawalpindi each year. Children who have attained the age of 4 years or 4+ but less than 5 years are eligible for admission in Class Prep while the age limit for admission to class 1 is 5 to 6 years. Relaxation in age is not allowed.

## **Test & Interviews**

Children who fulfill the eligibility criteria specified in the Admission Notice and have been registered are called for test/interview. Tests in English, Urdu, Mathematics, and General Intelligence/Aptitude are conducted from the prescribed syllabus furnished along with the Registration Form. Admission is granted strictly on the basis of merit.

#### Class II to Class X

# Registration/Admission Test

Candidates are registered for admission subject to availability of seats in respective classes. Federal Government employees, seeking admission for their children on transfer basis have to produce relevant documents before they are given admission test in the subjects mentioned below against each class.

# **Subjects**

II to V	English, Urdu, Mathematics
VI to IX	English, Urdu, Mathematics, G. Science

## INTERMEDIATE PROGRAM

- Admission to all classes is purely on merit.
- Students desirous of seeking admission to FA/F.Sc (1st Year) must have passed the SSC Examination.
- Admissions for F.A./F.Sc are opened within ten days of the announcement of the SSC results by the Federal Board of Intermediate & Secondary Education, Islamabad in July/August every year.

- Students placed in compartment will have to fulfill the requirements for admission to 1st year in the next session after they pass the supplementary examination and fall within the merit determined by the College, (Admission in such cases depends on the availability of seats).
- The Principal reserves the right to refuse admission to any student whose behavior and conduct in the previous years has not been found satisfactory. Students who have appeared in the Senior Cambridge, GCE/'O' level 'A' level examinations must submit equivalence certificate for admission.
- All foreign students are required to send their applications through the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. (NOC is required in case of change in Education Board).
- No claim is entertained from students who have been admitted in the evening shift for their transfer to the Morning shift. Father/Guardian of each student joining the college in the evening shift shall have to furnish an "Undertaking" on stamp paper not to request transfer of his daughter/ward into morning shift under any circumstances throughout the academic year.

#### Note:

Number of seats in each group is fixed according to the availability of physical facilities and the number of academic staff. Applicants seeking admission to 1st year have to apply on the prescribed application form issued by the college office. They are required to attach the following documents along with the application form:

- An attested copy of the SSC certificate along with the mark sheet issued by the Federal Board or any other Board. Provisional certificate signed by the Head of Institution last attended.
- School/College leaving certificate attested by the previous Head of Institution an Affidavit, 4 Passport size photographs. (Photographs should be in uniform and attested across the front) and copy of I.D Card of Parents /Guardian.
- Applicants seeking admission in different groups must submit separate forms for each option. No request for change of group will be entertained after the date of submission of admission forms is over.
- Medium of instruction of ICG is English for all classes /subjects/groups.

Note: Note: If any document is found to be TAMPERED, the student will not be given admission.

## **MIGRATION**

Students migrating from a Board/ University other than the Federal Board/ Quaid-e-Azam University must produce the following:-

- Character and College leaving Certificates from the Head of Institution last attended.
- Attendance record.
- Migration Certificate from Secretary/ Registrar of the Board/ University.
- Equivalence Certificate in case of students who have passed 0/ A levels.
- Students who have appeared in the previous exams as private candidates must produce a character certificate from a gazette Class-1 Officer, not related to the student.

#### DISCIPLINE RULES

Students must not indulge in any activity which may disrupt the normal functioning of the college such as:-

- Willful damage to the college property.
- Meeting or gathering of any kind without the permission of the Principal.
- Cell phones, Cameras, IPod or any other electronic devices found with the students will be confiscated.
- Visit to the canteen while classes are in progress.
- Incidents of fights and brawls will be handed over to the Discipline Committee and reported to the Principal.

# **Attendance and Medical Information**

# Attendance

Punctuality and regularity in the college is the most important aspect of college life. Violation of this will not be accepted. A student who remains ABSENT from the college for three consecutive days without sending an application her name will be struck off from the college roll. Medical leave is allowed with Medical Certificate from a government hospital only.

75% attendance in all subjects is mandatory and pre-requisite for taking final exams in the University and Board.

## **Medical Information**

- Parents are directed to inform college authorities about any serious medical problem regarding their child.
- Students with air borne infections should not be sent to the college.
