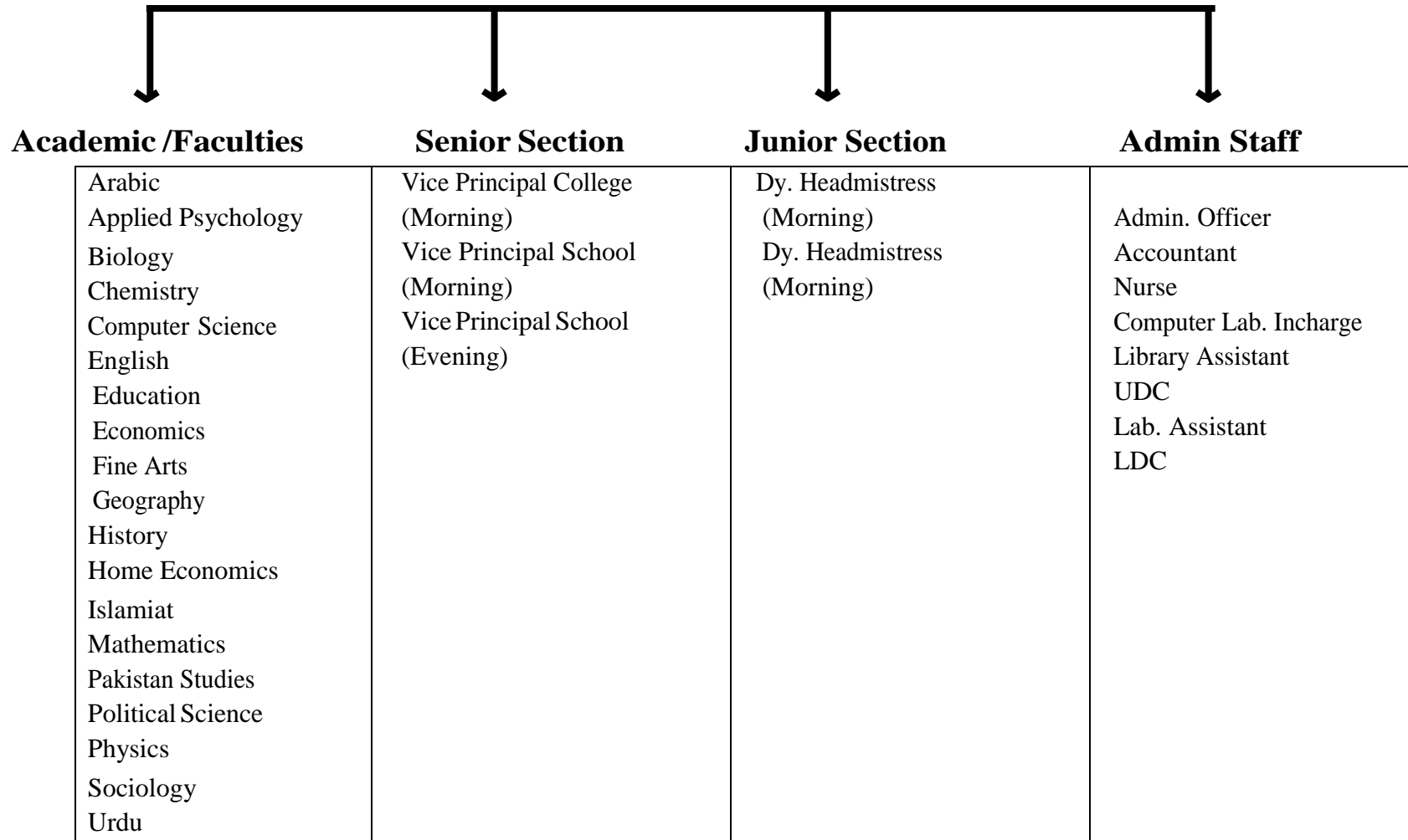

Academic Structure and Programs Overview

Islamabad College for Girls (ICG) offers a comprehensive academic framework that supports students throughout every stage of their educational journey. From foundational learning in the junior section to advanced degree programs, ICG ensures a smooth and structured progression tailored to each academic level.

The institution is organized into distinct sections aligned with educational milestones, providing focused and age-appropriate learning experiences. Whether students are beginning their academic path or pursuing specialized higher education, ICG is dedicated to fostering intellectual growth, academic excellence, and personal development.

Academic Divisions

Junior Section (Prep to Class V)

This foundational stage emphasizes the development of essential academic skills. Students are introduced to core subjects in a nurturing environment that fosters curiosity, creativity, and a love for learning, laying the groundwork for future academic achievement.

Senior Section (Classes VI to X)

The Senior Section delivers a broad-based curriculum that prepares students for higher secondary education. Alongside core academic subjects in sciences, humanities, and general education, the section also offers technical subjects to equip students with practical skills and vocational knowledge. This diverse academic approach ensures a well-rounded and future-ready learning experience.

College Section (Classes XI–XII)

The College Section offers the Higher Secondary School Certificate (HSSC) programs with specialized academic streams, including Pre-Medical, Pre-Engineering, General Science, and Humanities. These programs are designed to equip students with the foundational knowledge and academic rigor required for success in university education and professional fields.

BS Programs (Four-Year Degree Programs)

ICG offers four-year Bachelor of Science (BS) programs in Chemistry, Psychology, and English, affiliated with Quaid-i-Azam University. These degree programs are structured to provide students with comprehensive theoretical understanding and practical skills, aligning with the evolving demands of the modern job market and higher education standards.

Admission Policy

Islamabad College for Girls (ICG) welcomes applications from Federal Government employees' children residents of the Federal Capital Territory, and the children of diplomats stationed in Islamabad. Admissions are offered at key entry points: **Prep/ECE II, Class I, Class XI (HSSC Part-I), and BS (Part-I)** programs. Following are the admission requirements listed according to the classes.

Prep/ECE II and Class I

Registration

Admission notices for Prep and Class I are published annually in leading newspapers of Islamabad and Rawalpindi.

- **Eligibility for Prep/ECE II:** Children aged **4 to under 5 years**
- **Eligibility for Class I:** Children aged **5 to 6 years**

Test & Interviews

Registered candidates who meet the eligibility criteria are called for test and interview. Assessment is conducted in **English, Urdu, Mathematics, and General Intelligence/Aptitude**, based on the syllabus provided with the registration form. Admissions are granted strictly on the basis of merit.

Class II – X

Admission to Classes II through X is subject to seat availability. Children of Federal Government employees seeking admission on a transfer basis must submit relevant documentation before appearing for the admission test.

Higher Secondary School Certificate (HSSC) Program

The **Intermediate Program** at Islamabad College for Girls, affiliated with the Federal Board of Intermediate & Secondary Education (FBISE), Islamabad, has been offered since **1965**. This two-year program, based on the Annual Examination System, is designed to equip students with a strong academic foundation, preparing them for higher education and professional excellence.

Eligibility Criteria and Admission Policy for Intermediate / HSSC Classes

As notified by the Federal Directorate of Education (FDE), Islamabad

Basic Eligibility Criteria

On-merit Admission to Intermediate Classes is open to students who have successfully passed the **Secondary School Certificate (SSC)** or equivalent examination, provided they meet any of the following categories:

- Daughters of Federal Government employees residing in Islamabad / Rawalpindi.
- Daughters of residents of the Islamabad Capital Territory (ICT).
- Daughters of diplomats stationed in Islamabad.

Proof of ICT Residence: Candidates who have passed their last examination from an institution located in Islamabad or its federal area must submit a **Residence Certificate** issued by the Estate Office / CDA or any other valid legal document in support of their claim.

General Admission Instructions

Admission Notification

The Federal Directorate of Education (FDE) will issue HSSC admission notices within 10 days following the declaration of the FBISE SSC results. The college will process admissions strictly in accordance with the schedule announced by the FDE.

Seat Allocation

Determined by the college in consultation with FDE, based on faculty strength and infrastructure.

Single Admission Cycle

Admissions are made once per academic year, after the declaration of results, as per the schedule notified by the Federal Directorate of Education (FDE).

Gap-Year Applicants

- Must submit Gap Certificate on Stamp Paper
- Must submit an affidavit of good conduct from the last institution attended.
- Five (05) marks per gap year will be deducted from total marks for merit calculation.

Cambridge / GCE Students

Students who have appeared in Senior Cambridge / GCE O-Level examinations must submit a valid equivalence certificate issued by the IBCC (Inter Boards Coordination Commission (IBCC), at the time of admission.

Foreign Students

All foreign applicants must submit their admission applications through the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Government of Pakistan. In cases involving a change of education board, a valid No Objection Certificate (NOC) is mandatory.

Discipline Clause

The Principal reserves the right to refuse admission to any student whose past conduct or academic behavior has been unsatisfactory.

FATA/FANA Domicile Rule

Candidates domiciled in FATA/FANA will not be eligible under the reserved quota if they have passed SSC/HSSC from outside these regions. However, they may be considered if seats remain vacant.

Sports Quota Admissions

Candidates applying under the Sports Quota must submit valid and verified sports certificates issued by the relevant Board or National Authority.

Hifz-ul-Quran Bonus

20 additional marks will be awarded to candidates who submit a verified Hifz-ul-Quran certificate from a recognized institution.

Guardianship Clause

If the guardian is not a parent, a legal affidavit/guardianship certificate is required. Accepted guardians: grandparents, elder siblings, and uncles.

Subject Change

No change of subjects is ordinarily allowed. In extreme hardship, a change may be permitted within two weeks of commencement of classes, and only to an equal or lower-merit group.

1. Character Certificate and College Leaving Certificate issued by the head of the last attended institution
2. Attendance Record from the previous institution
3. Migration Certificate issued by the Secretary or Registrar of the relevant board or university
4. Equivalence Certificate (for O-Level/A-Level students) issued by the Inter Board Committee of Chairmen (IBCC)
5. Students who appeared as private candidates must submit a Character Certificate from a gazetted Class-I Officer (not related to the student)

Discipline Rules

ICG upholds a culture of respect, responsibility, and academic integrity. All students are expected to maintain discipline and adhere to the college's code of conduct. The following actions are strictly prohibited:

1. Willful damage to college property
2. Organizing meetings or gatherings without prior approval from the Principal
3. Possession or use of cell phones, cameras, iPods, or other electronic devices on campus (confiscation will apply)
4. Visiting the canteen during class hours
5. Wearing makeup and jewellery is not permitted. Students are not allowed to bring any beauty/ vanity item to school/college.
6. Involvement in fights or brawls, which will be referred to the Discipline Committee and reported to the Principal for appropriate action

Attendance and Medical Information

Attendance Policy

- A minimum of 75% attendance in each subject is mandatory and a prerequisite for appearing in final examinations conducted by the **Federal Board** and **Quaid-i-Azam University**.
- Punctuality and regular attendance are essential aspects of college life. Any violation of this policy will not be tolerated.
- A student who remains absent for three consecutive days without submitting a written application will have her name struck off the college roll.
- Medical leave is granted only upon submission of a valid medical certificate from a government hospital.

Medical Information

- Parents are required to inform the college authorities about any serious medical conditions affecting their child.
- Students suffering from airborne infections must not attend college until fully recovered, to ensure the health and safety of others.

Examinations / Tests

To ensure consistent academic progress, examinations and tests are conducted regularly across all classes. The schedule and policies for internal assessments are as follows:

1. **Monthly and Weekly Tests:** Subject teachers conduct regular monthly or weekly tests. The results are reviewed and discussed with the Principal to monitor student performance.

2. **Send-up Examinations (F.A./F.Sc.):** These are held in December and January to prepare students for their final board examinations.
3. **Annual Examinations (F.A./F.Sc. and BS Programs):** Final examinations are conducted according to the schedules announced by the **Federal Board** and **Quaid-i-Azam University**, respectively.
4. **Passing Criteria:** A minimum of **40% marks** is required to pass Monthly Tests, Periodicals, and Send-up Examinations.
5. **Parent Communication:** Results of all tests and examinations are shared with parents. Individual student progress is discussed during the Open Day, held once every academic session.
6. **Student Progress Records:** A detailed academic progress record for each student is maintained by the Class Incharge.

3. Basic Eligibility

A candidate holding a Higher Secondary School Certificate, from a Pakistani Board or an equivalent certificate from any other recognized institution, with at least 50% marks is eligible for admission to the BS Program.

4. Age Limit

The maximum age for admission to BS programs is 22 years. Candidates above this age may be granted relaxation only under special circumstances, subject to the Vice-Chancellor's approval on the Principal's recommendation.

5. Equivalence Certificate

Applicants with foreign qualifications (e.g., A-Level or equivalent) must submit an Equivalence Certificate and grade-to-marks conversion from the Inter Board Committee of Chairmen (IBCC) for both Matric and Intermediate levels. Local institutions awarding CGPA must also provide official conversion to marks or percentage.

6. Merit Criteria

Merit is calculated using the following formula:

- Matric/SSC or equivalent: 30%
- F.A./F.Sc. or equivalent: 70%

$$\text{Merit} = (\text{MOM}) / \text{TM} \times 30\% + (\text{MOF}) / \text{TM} \times 70\%$$

Where:

- MOM = Marks Obtained in Matric or Equivalent
- MOF = Marks Obtained in F.A./F.Sc. or Equivalent

7. Merit List

Merit lists of selected candidates will be displayed on the college notice board and website as per the announced schedule. No individual call letters will be issued. Admission to one department does not guarantee migration to another; therefore, candidates must apply separately for each program using individual application forms.
